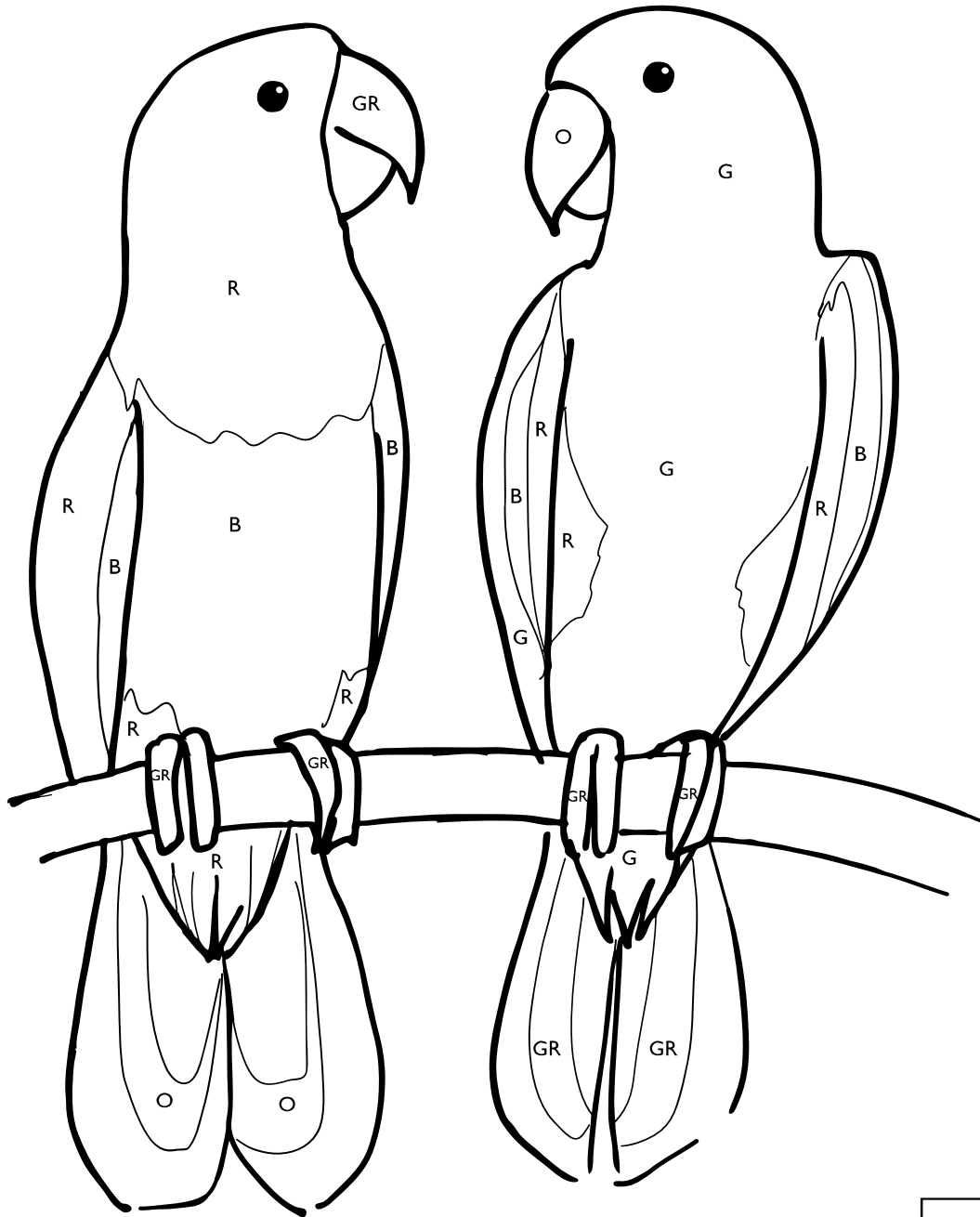


ECLECTUS

(*Eclectus roratus*)



Eclectus are a medium-sized parrot that is spread from Australia to New Guinea and other nearby islands. The males look much different than the females. Males are green with red underwing feathers and yellow-orange beaks. Females are mostly red, with a purplish-blue breast and a black beak. They eat fruits, nuts, flowers and buds in the trees where they perch and nest. They lay two eggs that hatch after 24 to 26 days and the chicks begin leaving the nest around 11 weeks of age.
